A Transition Team of GSAA members has been charged with identifying potential options for transitioning the GSAA to a new model of regional partnership that better fits the needs of the region. As a first step, the Transition Team issued a survey to assess broad stakeholder interest in developing a new network and the focus for such a network. This meeting is the next step in transitioning the GSAA, providing an opportunity for participants to form the vision of a revitalized regional network that builds on the GSAA's successes in understanding coastal vulnerabilities, assessing the health of coastal watersheds, and building community resilience through creative solutions (e.g. living shorelines, clean and resilient marinas).
